

## INFORMATION FOR AUTHORS

*ISSUES & STUDIES* (ISSN 1013-2511), published quarterly by the Institute of International Relations, is an internationally peer-reviewed journal dedicated to publishing quality social science research on issues—mainly of a political nature—related to the domestic and international affairs of contemporary China, Taiwan, and East Asia, as well as other closely related topics. The editors particularly welcome manuscripts related to China and Taiwan.

Authors may submit via e-mail an original manuscript copy, a half-page summary, and five keywords in Word, DOS text, or other IBM-compatible format to <[issues@nccu.edu.tw](mailto:issues@nccu.edu.tw)>. In order to ensure the anonymity of the review process, *we ask that all correspondence regarding submissions be directed to this e-mail account.*

The journal requires that all submitted manuscripts have not, either in part or in whole, been previously published in any form and are not currently being considered by any other journal for publication. English-language versions of papers published earlier in another language are acceptable as long as the original publication venue (and translator of English version, if applicable) are disclosed at the time of submission. The author should also spell out the background of the manuscript upon submission, including if the paper has been presented at any conferences or has appeared on-line in any form.

The manuscript should be in Times New Roman 12-point font, 1.5 spacing, and (including notes and tables) range roughly between 7,000 and 15,000 words. In addition to a **full bibliographical list**, notes should be placed either at the end of the manuscript (endnotes) or at the bottom of the page (footnotes); *parenthetical notation is not accepted.* Tables should be typed on separate sheets. All figures and maps should be provided in acceptable camera-ready form.

Notes should contain complete bibliographical information. For the proper form of notes and bibliography and all matters of style, please consult the 15th edition of *The Chicago Manual of Style* (University of Chicago Press, 2003), examples from which are provided below.

The title page should include only the article title, author's name and current institutional affiliation, and a fifty-word (or less) biographical statement including such information as positions held, area of specialization, major publications, research-in-progress, and e-mail address.

◆ **Chinese-language sources:** Authors should supply transliteration of all sources that are originally published in the Chinese language, including books, journals, and newspapers.

◆ **Popular magazines:** For popular magazines, there is no need to write down volume or issue numbers.

◆ **Subsequent citations:**

Use "ibid." to refer to a single work cited in the immediately preceding note. "Op. cit." (*opere citato*, "in the work cited") and "loc. cit." (*loco citato*, "in the place cited") should not be used.

Use shortened title for previously cited sources: [English] Author's last name, Shortened Title of the Book/Article, page(s); [Chinese] Author's last name, Shortened Title of the Book/Article," page(s).
